The DREF National Reading Circle is designed to engage women throughout America in reading classic works and scholarly literature by and about women

of color. Each year, a book is chosen for discussion during a virtual book talk.

This year's book is the New York Times Bestseller, *The First Ladies* by Marie Benedict and Victoria Christopher Murray. The historical fiction selection tells the story of friendship between First Lady of the United States, Eleanor Roosevelt and Founder of the National Council

of Negro Women, Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, often called "The First Lady of Negro America" or "The First Lady of The Struggle".

The intergenerational book discussion is open to persons of all backgrounds. In the rich tradition of collaboration, it is jointly sponsored by the Sister Scholars Advisory Council of the Delta Research and Educational Research Foundation and

the National Council of Negro Women. Speakers include Rev. Shavon L. Arline-Bradley, President and CEO, NCNW; Renee Harper, President, DREF Board

# Financial Health and Wellness Program

The Delta Research and Educational Foundation (DREF) Financial Health and Wellness Program was a 10-week, interactive learning experience for more than 1,000 participants throughout the United States and Caribbean Islands. The program launched in September and ended in November 2023.

The objectives of the initiative were for participants to:

- Understand how financial success can lead to accomplishing major goals, i.e. getting an education, purchasing an automobile, purchasing a home, and saving for retirement.
- Learn how to establish credit and maintain good credit.
- Gather knowledge about financial institutions such as banks, loan companies, check-cashing facilities, investment firms, and insurance companies.
- Understand the concepts of saving and spending.

The program was facilitated by financial expert Dr. Lynn Richardson and her team

# **DREF Sister Scholar The Historical Consultant for Shirley**

Dr. Zinga A. Fraser is the Director of the Shirley Chisholm Project on Brooklyn Women's Activism. She is also an Assistant Professor in the Africana Studies and Women's and Gender Studies at Brooklyn College. Dr. Fraser is a foremost expert on Shirley Chisholm and Black Congressional Women's politics. For over 18 years, Dr. Fraser has devoted her time to preserving a legacy of Chisholm, both in the academy and public.

Dr. Fraser served as the Historical Consultant to the feature Netflix Film, *Shirley* chronicling her groundbreaking run for president of the United States. She worked closely with Regina King and John Ridley, who wrote and directed the film that premieres March 22. To commemorate the centennial



of the birth of Shirley Chisholm, Dr. Fraser is the co-curator of the first major museum exhibition on the life and legacy of Chisholm, opening at the City of New York Museum in June 2024. (Continued on page 2)

# Brown v Board of Education of Topeka (1954) Commemorative Artwork

DREF is pleased to announce that Dr. Kathi Earles Ross, an Atlantabased physician and artist has been commissioned to create commemorative artwork in honor of the 70th anniversary of the landmark Brown v. Board (1954) Supreme Court decision.

The mixed media piece depicts the legacy of Brown v. Board of Education, utilizing

historical imagery and a variety of materials to capture the struggle and hope for a more equitable future. At the heart of the composition is imagery that tells the story of numerous epic moments of that period. The artist sets the framework by using a backdrop reflecting many of the historical moments including the grandeur of Thurgood Marshall following the decision and young Linda Brown as she walked through the angry crowd and into the doors of the school. The vintage classroom is displayed with a patchwork of newspaper clippings, photographs, and legal documents that assist in telling the story of the time. The monochromatic backdrop is contrasted with an array of colors and materials used to depict the presence of excitement and hope, seen through

the new student's eyes. The piece is not merely a tribute to the pivotal moment of American history but a call to reflect, prepare and rise up for the ongoing journey towards equality.

"Since completing the course I've eliminated \$200 of monthly

unnecessary expenses. With those funds I was able to apply those savings towards credit card debt. The tools learned during the courses have impacted how I think about my earnings and savings!"

As a result of 5,000 registered program participants, it is our hope that the more than 1,000 persons who took part in the program will improve their lives and financial health by continuing to engage in best practices. Based on need and responses from participants, DREF hopes to continue the work of promoting Financial Health and Wellness.

Additionally, as DREF prepares to return to a hybrid in-office schedule, we are currently improving our information technology to ensure that better business performance is provided to you, our customers by: (1) Providing higher quality service, (2) Enhancing customer service to our chapters, and (3) Reducing waste. Several 2024 First Quarter goals also include: improving the Scholarship & Community Empowerment Grant online application process, providing an electronic back-up plan for Microsoft 365, as well as hiring new staff members to increase organizational capacity.
